YOUTH LEADERSHIP BRIDGE TO COLLEGE PROGRAM (YLBTCP)

DIGITAL LITERACY AND TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

LAHC offers weekly, bilingual classes on topics related to Google Suite, social media, cyber security and online safety. By programs end, participants will feel more able to achieve their educational and occupational goals.



ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE CLASSES

Immigrants and newly arrived refugees learn to read, write, and communicate in English. This assists them in becoming active and informed parents, workers, and community members. Classes are offered 5 days a week for beginning, intermediate, and advanced learners.



BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

BLOOMING MINDS

A Recreational Therapy program aiming to promote mental wellness among community members within Wayne County by providing evidence-based interventions to decrease feelings of stress, anxiety, and depression, promote a healthy leisure lifestyle, and improve overall quality of life.

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES & AUTISM SERVICES

Pathways provides therapeutic services & educational interventions for middle & high school aged youth with developmental disabilities and autism spectrum disorder. The curriculum follows an evidence-based behavioral model that promotes active participation and cooperative interactions amongst students. Each series focuses on communication, social, and coping skills as well as developing and maintaining relationships. Intervention objectives support students as they build individual skill repertoires to reach long term independence.





HEALTHY LIVING – OBESITY PREVENTION

The Healthy Living Program is focused on empowering adults, children and families in underserved communities to take control of their own health. Through a combination of cooking and fitness classes and hands-on nutritional content, program participants learn how diet and exercise directly impact their health.



SOCIAL SERVICES

HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

In response to the need of the community, the City of Dearborn Block Grant-Coronavirus Subsistence Program has been created to help Dearborn Residents who have fallen behind on their housing and utility payments and those facing evictions, displacements and/or utility shut offs due to Covid-19.











