Providing comprehensive behavioral and mental health services, including evidence-based therapeutic interventions, recreational therapy, and specialized supports for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and autism spectrum disorder, promoting wellbeing, skill development, and culturally responsive care.

Health Promotion & Maternal and Family Wellness

Empowering families from pregnancy to adulthood. Through Mom Care Connect, Maternal Health Navigators, and hands-on nutrition, cooking, and fitness programs, we equip expectant mothers, children, and families with the tools & resources to access care, build healthy habits, and thrive.

Substance Use Disorder Prevention

Providing prevention, early intervention, and recovery support to reduce substance misuse and strengthen communities. Through education, family engagement, diversion, and harm-reduction efforts, LAHC equips youth and families to make healthy decisions and build resilience.

Social Services

Supporting families year-round through food access and essential resource distributions, including the Forgotten Harvest Mobile Market, our in-house food pantry, an annual turkey drive, and a back-to-school backpack giveaway that help reduce barriers and strengthen community stability.

LAHC secured a \$500,000 matching grant through the Michigan Central Station Children's Endowment Initiative, which, when fully matched, will create a \$1.5 million permanent endowment; ensuring a legacy of hope, equity, and opportunity for generations of Southeast Michigan residents.



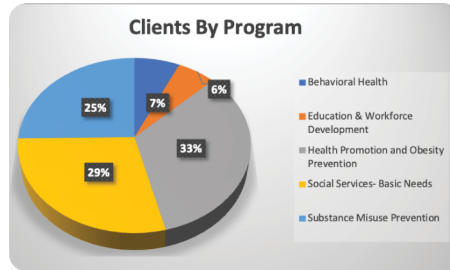
LAHC Community Health Hub Grand Opening

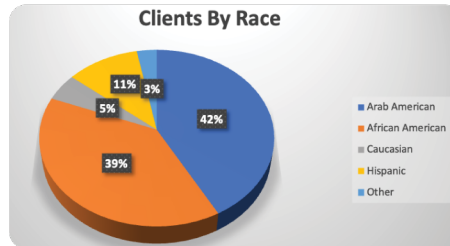

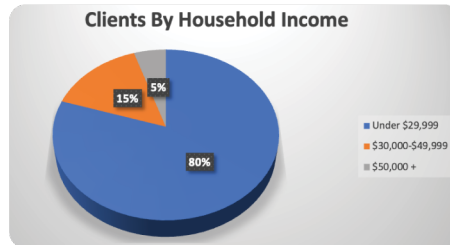
CLIENTS BY RACE

Other.....	3%



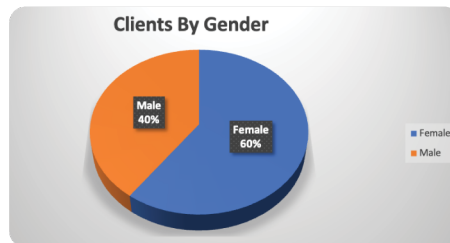
CLIENTS BY HOUSEHOLD INCOME

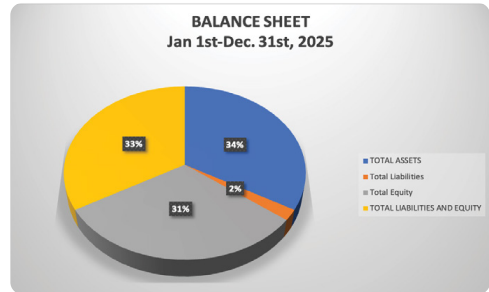

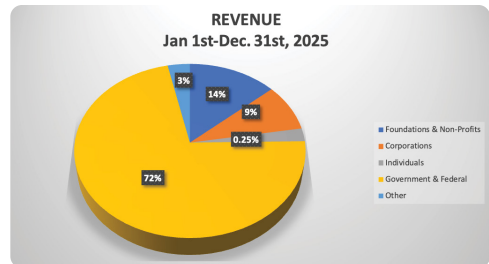

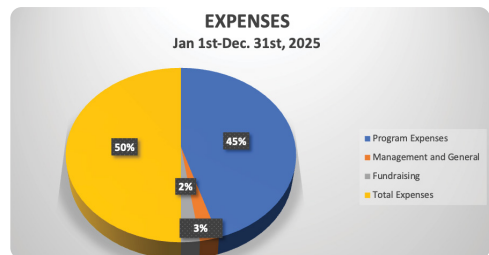
